INTRODUCTION

WHAT EVEN IS MEMBERSHIP EXACTLY?

What's important is that you're here now, and you have an opportunity to make a new commitment to your church home. Becoming a member is like officially joining a team. You practice with the team. You make it public. You tell the world, "This is my church. I belong here. I'm here for them. They're here for me. I want everyone to know." That's membership.

THE ONE BIG QUESTION

Each chapter asks *one big question*. You'll get to ask and answer like a thousand tiny questions along the way, but at the end of the lesson you'll have an opportunity to actually answer this one big question in your own words.



LOOK IT UP

We're going to be using our Bibles. A lot. You'll want to bring your Bible from home or talk with your leader about providing you with a Bible. It's an amazing tool that will guide us as we explore each question. At the beginning of each chapter, you'll find a list of Scriptures that are used in the chapter. Each chapter of this membership book is split into three major sections. The **Belong** section is all about finding our place in the bigger story of our faith. God's been revealing his story to us for thousands of years. We'll meet some important people from that story, and figure out how their story and our story fit together. We'll call these people the *Belong Bunch*. **Believe** is all about learning important Christian truths revealed in the Bible. We'll study, read, and do activities that help us remember. **Become** is all about taking what we learned in the first two sections and applying it to our lives. How do these truths help us become people who are more like Jesus? What can we do to grow our faith together?

BELONG

BELONG BUNCH

We belong to a bunch of people throughout history who help us understand and live our faith. This is our community.

Rev. Dr. Phineas F. Bresee

In the late 1800's there was a Methodist pastor in southern California named Phineas F. Bresee (bruh-ZEE). He felt led to minister to some of Los Angeles's poorest people. He worked with a rescue mission there for a while and then started a church that was dedicated to ministering to entire families. They called this brand new church the Church of the Nazarene.

More Nazarene churches started from there. Bresee talked with other churches that weren't Nazarene and realized that they had many of the same ideas and goals. So, they got together and formed an official partnership. In 1908 the Nazarene denomination was born. (A denomination is a group of churches all connected under a common theology, goal, leadership, and name.)

There are LOTS of denominations around the world. Like, tens of thousands. Almost all of them have similar stories of being connected to another denomination, and then differences in leadership led them to begin on their own. Denominations who are very similar to us are: Methodists, Wesleyans, The Salvation Army, and Free Methodists. Some others you might have heard of, that believe much of what we do but have some differences, are: Baptist, Presbyterian, Assembly of God, Church of Christ, and Lutheran. But the overall list of denominations is much, much bigger!







This ultra-intelligent super-computer knows every word that's ever been said. Let's learn a brand new word



From the Greek word meaning *universal*. You are a Nazarene, but you're also part of a whole, inclusive, worldwide church. In the Apostles' Creed, it's called the "holy catholic church." This can be confusing because there's also a church called the Catholic Church. Here's a hint: look for the big C or little c. If it's big—Catholic—it's the denomination. If it's little—catholic—it's all believers, no matter their denomination.

Here are more important words to watch out for: denomination, Nazarene Manual, holiness, and Core Values.

Our Nazarene Manual* states, "The Church of the Nazarene confesses itself to be a branch of Christ's 'one, holy, universal, and apostolic' church." In other words, we believe God's church is bigger than just the Nazarenes. We have brothers and sisters in Christ all over the world in lots of denominations. We love the same God and read the same Bible. We are all Christians and we're part of one, big, giant, Jesus-following, others-loving, holy catholic church.

BELIEVE

Check out **John 1:43-46**. Nazareth was known for being a place full of everyday, ordinary people. So, when people heard Jesus was from Nazareth, they went, "Wait, that's *not* where rich, famous, and powerful people come from. Why does he matter?" But then, Jesus's words and loving way of life started changing the world. That's the idea behind our name, Nazarene. We strive to

live as Jesus the Nazarene did. The Church of

the Nazarene wants to be a place where everyone belongs, especially those who Jesus always reached out to: people with needs, those who feel like outsiders, or those who need freedom from sin and brokenness.

*The Church of the Nazarene Manual is a book that clearly explains our theology and how we do life together. It helps people organize and operate Nazarene churches and organizations. We'll talk more about this in Chapter 3. Nazarenes believe people can change. This means our minds, hearts, and lives can be made new and made like Jesus. It also means we can work together to help the world be a better place. From the earliest days, Nazarenes worked to bring spiritual and social changes.

SPIRITUAL AND SOCIAL CHANGE

Nazarenes are a Christian people. We were created to be in a relationship with Jesus that keeps growing. As our Savior, Jesus forgives us and we accept his love. As our King, Jesus provides for us and we give him our worship and obedience. As our Friend, Jesus guides us, and we follow him no matter what.

Nazarenes are a Holiness people. Jesus changes us, sanctifying us to be more like him. His desires become our desires. His plans become our plans. We call this holiness.

Nazarenes are a Missional people. Like Jesus taught, we are to be a part of making our world the way God created it to be—a peaceful, just, and beautiful place. This has been the call of Nazarenes

since the start. Whether that is telling people about Jesus, feeding people, educating and discipling people, giving people places to live, thinking about how our choices affect others, or speaking up for others, we believe God has given all of us this mission. Jesus was the perfect model for it.

Quick review. Nazarenes are a Christian people. Nazarenes are a Holiness people. Nazarenes are a Missional people. We have a name for these three phrases. We call them our *Core Values*. Everything we do is inspired by these values.
